

Transcription of Bound Book of Minutes from the Town of Scarsdale: 1787 to 1864

Transcribed by Daniel Glauber, Reference &
Local History Librarian, Scarsdale Public Library

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Introduction

The following work is a transcription taken from a bound book of handwritten minutes and other documents from the Clerk's office of the Town of Scarsdale. The book cover is brown. The book has the following dimensions: 12.5" x 8", and 1" thick. There are no discernible markings or labels on the cover or the spine. The original is kept in the Lederer Historical Room at the Scarsdale Public Library.

I have purposely left spelling mistakes as they are in the original document. Where I was unable to make out the handwriting I used question marks to indicate that I could not determine the word, letters, or numbers.

We the Subscribers Commissioners appointed to lay out and alter Highways in the manner of Scarsdale do certifie that their has been exhibited to us the oaths of twelve Treeholders of the County of Westchester according to law that an alteration is nessesary to be made in the highway formerly laid out from the road that leads from White Plains to Mamoranack which highway began a small distance south of the house of Benjamin Cornell and so runs south westerly to New Rochell line We do therefore in pursuance of the said request alter the said road or highway in manner and form following Vis Beginning two chanes and fourteen links south from an apple tree standing by the road in the corner of Benjamin Cornell's cow yard from thence south westward to a large rock west of a small brook from thence southward to a bunch of chestnuts from thence westerly by the land of William Griffen to said Griffens northwest Corner from thence by Benjamin Cornell's land as the fence now stands to the New Rochel line the said road to run on the north side of the before mentioned bounds the whole way and to be four rods wide given under our hands this twenty first day of May and in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Seven.

And it is agreed att this town meeting that if William Fisher Constable shall appear and give sufficent security to the clerk of the town for the collecting of the taxes laid upon the township of Scarsdale this year that the clerk shall deliver to the said William Fisher the tax lists for this year otherwise to be collected by the afore said collector Caleb Tompkins.

Be it enacted by the athrowity of this town meeting that if any hogs trespass not being ringed or snouted and yoked that it shall bew lawfull to drive them to Pound and the owner of said hogs shall pay Poundage and damages but if hogs be ringed or snouted and hoked and trespass and are drove to Pound the fence and damage viewers shall view the fence and if they shall think the fence reasonable against hogs they shall judge the damages and the owner of said hogs shall pay Poundage and Damages.

Be it enacted by the athority of this town meeting that the Fence and Damage Viewers shall receive for their services when caled on business att the rate of six shilling per day or so in proportion for a longer or shorter time.

It is also the act of this town meeting that no hogs shall be permitted to run in the highway unless they are sufficiently ringed or snouted so as to prevent them from rooting and if any hogs get in any persons enclosure from the highway being yoked and the fence insufficient shall not be liable to pay damages but if the fence be sufficient then the owner of said hogs shall be liable to pay such damages as the Fence and Damage Viewer shall judge.

This meeting adjourns to the usual time and place att one oclock

Be it enacted by the authority of this town meeting that no hogs shall be permitted to run in the Highway except they are ringed or snouted so as to prevent them from rutting and if any hogs shall get in any persons enclosure being yoked and ringed or snouted and the fence insufficient shall not be liable to pay damage but if the fence be sufficient then the owner of the said hogs shall be liable to pay such damage as the fence and damage viewers shall judge said law from High Ways and also to lines betwixt neighbours

The same law respecting hogs is reenacted by this town meeting with the addition of the poundage which shall be the sum of one shilling for each hog that shall be put in pound. It is also the act of this town meeting that the fence and damage viewers shall receive for their service the sum of six shillings per day or so in proportion for a longer or shorter time as the case may be. While in the execution of their said office it is the act of this town meeting that all fences against highways and division fences betwixt neighbours shall be four feet six inches high and not to exceed six inches under the bottom rail except well underpinned with stones nor to exceed six inches betwix rails until it comes to the fifth rail.

Tis the act of this town meeting that the Collector shall in the ensuing year account with the Clerk of this town of the money by him collected and that on or before the next annual day of town meetings this town. This town meeting adjourns to the usual place att two oclock

To the Town Clerk of the Town of Scarsdale, We Two of the Commissioners of Highways of said Town do hereby authorize and require you the said Clerk to record and also put on file in your said office this Instrument or writing, to wit, a description of a Highway or road this Day laid out by us in said Town on the south side of the herein after described line, Three rods wide, Commencing on the west side of the highway immediately east of the house of Richard Palmer, on the line between the lands of said Palmer and Samuel Cornell, or near the same, eighteen links east of the south east corner of Said Cornells Tenant house, and from thence running south sixty four degrees west eleven chains on the south of said Palmers & Cornells line to a stake, and from thence south sixty five degrees and thirty minutes west – fourteen chains to a stake in Palmers land, thence south sixty two degrees west ten chains to a stake in Cornells land near the woods, and from thence south seventy degrees west seven chains and forty links to the Town line, containing by estimation three acres and twenty five perches of land

The undersigned a person liable to be assessed for highway labour in said town and residing therein doth hereby make application to alter and describe a road of the width of two rods through the land of Samuel Cornell and other beginning at the corner of said Cornell's land adjoining the road leading from White Plains to Mamaroneck and running eastwardly through the said Cornells land keeping the track until it comes to the land of Hiram Benadict thence through the said Benadicts land following the old track by the barn and house until it comes near the Butter-nut tree thence along by the wall until ti comes to the track thence along said track until it comes to the land of Jacob Willetts thence through the said Willetts land following the old track until it comes to the land of Caleb & Jonathan Purdy thence through the said Purdys land keeping the old track until it comes to the Bridge, the line between White Plains and Scarsdale by the branch river so caled
